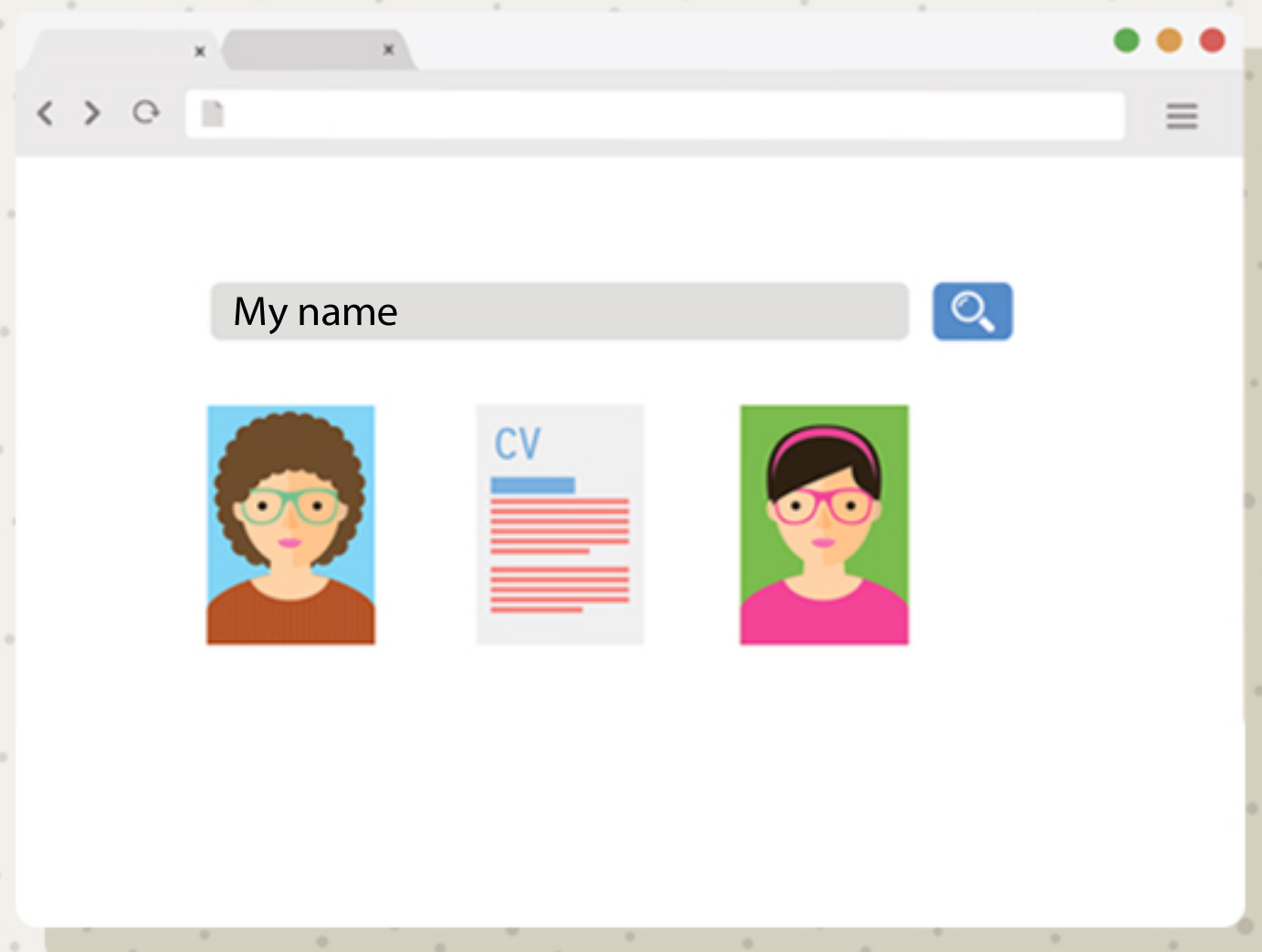


De-listing search-engine content concerning me



European residents can contact search engines to request de-listing of web content relating to their surnames and first names. De-indexing does not result in deletion of source content.



- 1 Contact the search engine via the dedicated form or by post
- 2 Justify your request :
«The content connected with *[this URL]* concerns me as it is related to:
an article in a blog showing my participation in [...] / *a directory publishing my contact details / etc.*
But this content is: inaccurate / obsolete / extreme / published without my knowledge / solely connected with my private life / etc.»
If there has been a negative impact on your private or professional life due to these results, specify it.
- 3 Attach an identity document



Deadline

The search engine has **one month** to reply but the request can be processed in a few days.



In the event of refusal

You can refer the matter to the CNIL via **its online complaint form**. You can also take the matter to court in order to have the facts checked and the necessary measures taken

What *criteria* might actually be taken into account by search engines and the CNIL

Supporting the request

- Individual rights under the GDPR
- Negative impact on privacy
- The information is obsolete
- The data is sensitive (sexual life, etc.)
- The information was not checked
- etc.

Against the request

- The information is of public interest
- It is a press article
- The requesting party is a public figure
- The content is related to professional life
- etc.
